SEN:6-1 APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE FIFTH MEETING OF THE SENATE HELD ON JULY 8, 2019

The Minutes of the "Fifth meeting of the Senate" held on July 8, 2019 was circulated to all members. There were no corrections/ changes suggested by the members. The minutes have been thereafter approved by the Chairperson.

Decision: *The senate approved and adopted the minutes of the fifth meeting of the senate held on July 8, 2019.*

SEN:6-2 APPROVE THE RESULTS FOR AUTUMN 2019-20 SEMESTER

The results of the Autumn semester 2019-20 was presented on the Table. The results of Autumn 2019-20 examination is enclosed in **Annexure- VI** for reference.

Decision: *The senate approved the results for Autumn 2019-20 semester.*

The senate recommended implementation of a well-planned student induction program should be introduced for 1st year B.Tech students. The training program should work towards improvement of student skills, overcome language barrier.

SEN:6-3 PROPOSAL FOR REPLACING TWO IN-SEMESTER EXAMINATIONS WITH ONE MID-SEMESTER EXAMINATION

In the second Senate meeting held on 28th October 2017 vide Agenda SEN:2-12 recommended, one mid-semester examination to be replaced by one two In-Semester exams. Based on feedback received from the faculty, it was proposed to revert back to one mid-semester examination with following provisions

1. Provision will be made for a makeup examination for students missing the mid semester examination due to medical/ other compelling approved reason.



2. The evaluation guidelines of other components will remain the same.
3. The weightage of components for evaluation of grades should have
 - a. Min 30% for mid-semester examination
 - b. Min 45% for end-semester examination
 - c. Max 25% for continuous evaluation which include quizzes, assignments, viva, projects, etc.
4. The evaluation policy for the course approved by the Director should be communicated to the students at the beginning of the semester.

Decision: *The proposal for replacing two in-semester examinations with one mid-semester examination is deferred till the new academic session 2020-21.*

SEN:6-4 APPROVE ACADEMIC CALENDAR WINTER 2019-20 SEMESTER

The Academic Calendar for Winter Semester 2019-20 is enclosed as **Annexure - I**. The senate approved the academic calendar for Winter 2019-20 with changes incorporated as per SEN: 6-3 minutes with two in-semester examinations.

SEN:6-5 APPROVE THE PROPOSAL FOR CONSIDERING SWAYAM COURSES AS REGULAR CREDIT COURSE UNDER INSTITUTE CURRICULUM

It was proposed to permit students to opt for one SWAYAM course which can be considered as a part of the course work towards the academic program the student has enrolled for. The evaluation for SWAYAM course will be considered for credit transfer. Following modality for this is approved:-

1. A list of courses on SWAYAM will be identified and notified to students before the beginning of the semester.
2. The course credit and evaluation process as laid down in SWAYAM course will be considered for credit transfer. The grade obtained on



SWAYAM will be transferred to an equivalent grade of IIIT Vadodara while transferring the credits.

3. For the entire duration of the program, a student will be permitted to register for at most one science elective and one humanities and social science elective in this mode.
4. In a semester, the students will be permitted to register for at most one course on SWAYAM.

SEN:6-6 APPROVE LIST OF STUDENTS TO BE DEBARRED FROM APPEARING END SEM EXAM ON ACCOUNT OF NOT MEETING ATTENDANCE CRITERIA

As per academic regulation Clause “BTR 3: Attendance and leave of absence”

3.1 (a). Students are required to attend all the classes (Lectures, tutorials, laboratories, practical, workshops etc.) for which they have registered.

(b). Students will have to attend all classes. A student may be debarred from appearing in an end semester examination if his / her attendance falls below 75% and will then be awarded an ‘F’ grade in that course.

In the autumn semester 2019-20, large number of students did not meet the attendance criteria (75% in each course). Following this **average aggregate attendance of 70% was considered. Students with lower than 70% attendance on average were not permitted to appear end semester examination for courses in which their attendance was < 70%.**

Exempted under Section 8 (1) (e) and Section 8 (1) (j) of RTI Act 2005

The attendance of 3rd and 4th year (5th and 7th semester) students was not taken into consideration for appearing examination. Almost all of these students appeared placement activities at the institute. The 3rd year students appeared for internship placement and 4th year students for semester project cum internship along with placement.

Decision: *The senate has taken a considerate view on the matter of students not meeting the institute attendance criteria. Following is approved:-*

1. *As a onetime relaxation, the attendance norm of 75% is relaxed and lowered to 70% for the Autumn 2019-20 session. This is a onetime relaxation and has no bearing on future.*
2. *For students who have failed to maintain minimum aggregate attendance of 70% and were debarred from appearing in the end-semester examination in courses with lower than 70% attendance, the senate on a special consideration permitted them to appear for supplementary examination. However, in such a course for which a student is appearing for supplementary, one grade penalty will be applied (which includes conversion from DD to F).*
3. *Students who have appeared the end semester examination in-spite of being debarred, their end-semester examination is null and void. How-ever they are permitted to appear for supplementary examination as per 2 above.*
4. *These students are awarded grade penalty of one grade point. The award of grade penalty will be handled by the academic section. Course instructors should provide grades based on actual evaluation. The academic section will reassign the grade with grade penalty.*
5. *As a special consideration all students with attendance <70 are permitted as per above rule/policy.*

SEN:6-7 TO APPROVE CHANGE IN ATTENDANCE POLICY AND LEAVE POLICY OF STUDENTS

The existing policy on student attendance and leave is placed in **Annexure - II.**

The proposed attendance policy is placed as **Annexure-III.**



Decision: The senate approved the proposed revision in attendance policy.

SEN:6-8.1 TO CONSIDER INTRODUCING M.TECH IN ECE.

Considering the need of expansion of PG programmes, Institute proposes to start a M.Tech programme in ECE from Academic Year 2020-21.

Decision: The senate in principal approved the M.Tech. in ECE programme. However, it also suggested that the curriculum be prepared and put up for approval of the senate in the next Senate meeting.

SEN:6-8.2 TO APPROVE SEAT MATRIX FOR ACADEMIC YEAR 2020-21

The guiding factors for calculating the number of seats is as under:

1. 10% supernumerary seats for women candidates is being applied. This is due to the fact that the admission of number of girls' students is reducing. In Academic Year 2019-20, only seven girls' students have taken admission.
2. Additional 5% seats is considered for EWS as per Government of India guidelines. This will complete the requirement of total 10% EWS seats in the Institute; as 5% quota was applied in Academic Year 2019-20.
3. Due to these increases in seats and limited infrastructure, 10% supernumerary seats for filling the vacant seats as applied in Academic Year 2019-20 is not being considered this year. With this the net affect will only be due to 5% increase in EWS seats.

Decision: The senate approved the proposed seat matrix for B.Tech and M.Tech academic program for Academic year 2020-21.

SEN:6-9 TO NOTE THE STUDENT NOMINATION TO THE STANDING DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE

As per ordinance of the Institute, students are required to be part of the Standing Disciplinary Committee. The List of the students nominated by Director for a period of one year for the Standing Disciplinary Committee are as under:

1. **One Female Student (UG or PG)-** Ms. Dharna Bhatt (Student ID: 201672001)
2. **One Male Student (PG) -** Mr. Patel Ashish Kumar (Student ID: 201771002)
3. **One Male Student (UG) -** Mr. Kartikey Lakhotia (Student ID: 201751020)

Decision: The senate noted the student nomination to standing disciplinary committee and appreciated the efforts of members in the committee (including student).

SEN:6-10 TO APPROVE PERMISSION ACCORDED TO STUDENTS OF 3RD AND 4TH YEAR BTECH STUDENTS TO STAY OUTSIDE HOSTEL.

The Institute has taken a hostel which is 32 km away from the Institute and is on the opposite side of Gandhinagar/ Ahmedabad. The students of 3rd and

4th Year had approached the Director to consider their request for staying outside the official hostel under their own arrangements as they have to attend regular classes for competitive exams and courses related to admissions for further studies.

Director after considering the requirements of the students and also that of the Institute agreed to permit the students of 3rd and 4th year to stay outside on the basis of the following guidelines:

1. Research students (M.Tech and PhD students).
2. Students in Third and Fourth year of their B.Tech program in Academic Year 2019-20 were considered only for the following reasons (This arrangement is for Academic Year 2019-20 only).

(a) Attending regular classes for National/ International level competitive examinations / training / attending part time courses/ programs at nationally recognized institutes and has to travel to the city of Gandhinagar or Ahmedabad on regular basis; subject to following:

(i) All students on probation and securing CPI below 6.0 have to stay in hostel.

(ii) All students who have attendance below 75%, in any course will have to stay in hostel.

(iii) Any other reason as considered appropriate by the Director on a case by case basis subjected to merit. For this student has to submit application with detailed reasoning duly recommended by their parents.

On the basis of the above guidelines, 35 students of 4th year and 14 students of 3rd year has been given permission in the Academic Year 2019-20. Some more requests are also coming now for the winter semester. Similar, guidelines are likely to follow in the next Academic Year as well.

Decision: *The senate has considered the hostel issue and the constraints. The senate approved the permission accorded to the students to stay outside the official hostel.*

SEN:6-11 GRANTING B.Sc. DEGREE IN PLACE OF B.TECH AS AN EARLY EXIT OPTION FROM B.TECH. PROGRAM



This agenda was approved in the Second Coordination Forum meeting of IIITs held on 16th October chaired by Hon'ble HRM (Item 2.6). After an in-house meeting held at the Institute, it is felt that in view of the limited resources in terms of infrastructure and faculty, this proposal should be deferred for the time being and shall be considered in due course once a reasonable model of its implementation is developed.

Decision: *The senate recommends that a proposal on granting B.Sc. degree in place of B.Tech. as an early exit option from B.Tech. program be drafted in line with the other INIs and develop a model for its implementation.*

SEN:6-12 NOMINATION OF EXPERT MEMBER FOR THE INTERVIEW OF THE OFFICERS AND STAFF

Exempted under Section 8 (1) (g) of RTI Act 2005.

SEN:6-13 REGISTRATION AND EVALUATION OF PC301 DESIGN PROJECT

Registration towards PC301 Design project was completed in Winter semester and the project was undertaken by students during the summer vacation. From this year, due to hostel and other logistic issues, it was decided that the students can undertake this project in Autumn semester. The students of 3rd year have registered for this course in Autumn semester (Academic Year 2019-20). However, the evaluation in terms of poster presentation is scheduled during the first week of January 2020. Due to this, the grades for PC301 will be reflected in the grade report of Winter semester (Academic Year 2019-20).

For the future, it is proposed that the evaluation be carried out at the end of Autumn semester just before the end-semester examination.

Decision: *The senate noted the change in registration and evaluation timeline of PC301 Design Project.*



SEN: 6-14 STUDENTS PERMITTED TO REPEAT FIRST YEAR 2018-19 BATCH STUDENTS EXCEPT ONE WHO WAS TERMINATED WHO COULDN'T MEET ACADEMIC REQUIREMENT EVEN AFTER REPEATING FIRST FOR SECOND TIME

With the permission of Chair, following one items were included in the Agenda.

SEN:6-15-1 PROPOSAL TO SHIFT EE170 BASIC ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING LABORATORY TO AUTUMN SEMESTER

As per the curriculum EE170 is assigned in synchronization with EE110 Basic Electrical Engineering during Winter semester (2nd semester curriculum).

Since the institute did not have sufficient space for laboratory, IIT Gandhinagar was approached for permitting students to use their laboratory. For Winter 2018-19, EE170 the laboratory work was carried out at IIT Gandhinagar. Based on the feedback received from IIT Gandhinagar, faculty members and laboratory staff involved in EE170, it is suggested that the same should be shifted to Autumn semester.

Primary reason being that all the experiments run in parallel for EE170 and it becomes difficult for students to follow the process and understand the expected outcomes of the experiments.



Based on the feedback received from faculty members, Laboratory Staff at IIT and students, it is proposed that the laboratory course EE170 be shifted to Autumn semester (3rd semester curriculum).

The credit distribution is placed in **Annexure- V** for reference.

Decision: *The senate approved the proposal to shift EE170 Basic Electrical Engineering Laboratory to Autumn semester.*

With no other item on the agenda, the meeting concluded with thanks to the Chair.

Office Order: Instructions on Attendance and Leave of Absence

1. The B.Tech Programme ordinance clause ("BTR 3: ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE OF ABSENCE") states the following:

*"3.1 (a) Students are required to attend all the classes (Lectures, Tutorials, Laboratories, Practical, Workshops etc) for which they have been registered.
(b) Students will have to attend all classes. A student may be debarred from appearing in an end semester examination if his/her attendance falls below 75 percent and will then be awarded an "F" grade in that course.*

Leave Of Absence

3.2 (a) Students are not expected to be away from the Institute during a semester.

(b) Students may be granted leave of absence on situations like death in the immediate family circle. Such leave will in no case exceed one week.

(c) Absence due to illness not exceeding three weeks will be allowed after taking due permission. Due to emergencies, such permission may be taken later, and by the guardian if necessary.

(d) If the period of absence in a semester exceeds three weeks, the student will have to drop the semester by dropping all courses he /she has registered for. The Senate may allow longer absences only in special circumstances and only after ascertaining the student's ability to make up for the lost time.

(e) The leave of absence as per Clauses 3.2 (a) to 3.2 (d) will not be condoned for attendance.

3.3 It will be the responsibility of the student to intimate the Warden of the hostel in which he/she is residing, and the concerned instructors regarding his/her absence before proceeding on leave."

2. It was observed that, during the winter semester 2018-19 many students had shortage of attendance. The senate had viewed this with seriousness. However the Senate had permitted students on a sympathetic ground as a special case. Considering the provision of academic



ordinance and the view of the Senate, students who do not meet the attendance criteria will not be permitted to appear the end semester examination.

3. It may be noted that earlier order (reference OO:IIITV/2017-18/40 dated 15th January 2018) regarding additional 5% attendance relaxation to students having CPI of 8.0 or more has been superseded and thus this relaxation is not available.

All students having CPI of 8.0 or more in the previous semester can have 30% of absence including reasons as mentioned in

"

4. Further, to the above, the students failing to meet the attendance criteria **will not be permitted to appear for the supplementary examination also.**

5. The student can present their case to Director 15 days in advance. The case will be considered on merit for any relaxation.

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Proposed Attendance Policy and Leave of Absence Policy for B Tech

The B.Tech Programme ordinance clause (BTR 3: ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE OF ABSENCE”) is modified as under:

3.1 (a) Students are required to attend all the classes (Lectures, Tutorials, Laboratories, Practical, Workshops etc.) for which they have been registered.

(b) A student should maintain 75% attendance in all courses. If the student's attendance is found between 60%-75% in a course, he/she will be awarded a one grade penalty (including DD to F) in the specifies course/s. The grade penalty will also be applied in supplementary exam following the regular semester in which student had been awarded grade penalty.

(c) If the student's attendance in a course remains below 60%, he/she will be un-registered from that course and will have to register for the same in the subsequent academic year/semester. Student will not be eligible to appear for the supplementary examination of that course.

Leave of Absence

3.2 (a) Students are expected to be at the Institute during a semester.

(b) Students may be granted leave of absence on situations like family calamity including death in the immediate family circle. Such leave will in no case exceed one week.

(c) Absence due to illness requiring hospitalization/ bed-rest of more than 1 week and not exceeding three weeks will be allowed after taking due permission. Due to emergencies, such permission may be taken later, and by the guardian if necessary. Absence due to medical reatment at home will not be considered under normal circumstances. This absence will be considered with in the 25% permitted absence. Students with critical medical complications can be permitted on merit. In such cases the student (or through relative) should apply for leave with all medical documents. Such cases will be considered only on merit. For such cases the student should have 85% attendance in remaining part of the semester. All such cases will be reported to the senate.

Link it with (g) and correlate and complete)

(d) If the period of absence in semester exceeds three weeks, the student will have to drop the semester by dropping all courses he/she has registered for. The Senate may allow longer absences only in special circumstances and only after ascertaining the student's ability to make up for the lost time.

(e) The leave of absence as per Clauses 3.2 (a) to 3.2 (d) will not be condoned for attendance.

(f) All absence up to 7 days including holidays will be considered with in 25% permitted absence.

(g) Under special circumstances long absence can be permitted by Senate Chairman if the student maintains 85% attendance in the remaining period. These permissions will only be granted in exceptional circumstances and reported to Senate.

3.3. It will be the responsibility of the student to intimate the Warden of the hostel in which he/she is residing, and the concerned instructors regarding his/her absence before proceeding on leave.
